

VOLUNTEERING AT LES BOURGS HOSPICE



Les Bourgs Hospice

Les Bourgs Hospice provides free, specialist care to any resident of the Bailiwick suffering with a life-limiting illness, as well as support to their loved ones and relatives. The Hospice can accommodate up to 7 patients at any one time in single occupancy, en-suite rooms and nursing care is provided 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. As an independent charity it does not receive any financial support from the States of Guernsey so relies on the income from its charity shops, fundraising activities and public support to cover the annual running costs which are approximately £1.75m.

Volunteering

Les Bourgs Hospice relies on volunteers to support many areas of its work and currently has around 130 volunteers working around the Hospice and the charity shops. All volunteers at Les Bourgs Hospice are greatly appreciated and to show gratitude a celebration is held each year during National Volunteers Week where recognition is given for 5 years, 10 years, 20 years and 30 years' service.

Key Information about Volunteering

- People from all backgrounds and walks of life volunteer for Les Bourgs Hospice, you just need some spare time.
- No special skills or qualifications are required as you will receive-on-the job training, but you do need to have a warm disposition, be empathetic and understand the importance of confidentiality.
- Volunteering will not leave you out of pocket as any expenses you incur will be reimbursed.
- You will be part of a highly valued team that ensures the continued high level of care the Hospice provides.
- Volunteering has a number of benefits such as learning new skills, building confidence, making new friends, gaining a sense of purpose by making a difference and can also be a lot of fun.

Volunteering Opportunities

Reception

Reception volunteers greet visitors and receive incoming telephone calls. No previous experience of working in offices is required, just a willingness to be a welcoming first point of contact for the public. Reception is manned between the hours of 9am until 5pm and volunteers provide cover in two hour shifts, either once a week or on an ad-hoc basis.

Supper Duty

This involves preparing light suppers e.g. sandwiches, soups, omelettes, salads and serving them to the patients on the ward, then tidying up afterwards. Supper duty is between 5pm – 7pm and you will be fully supported until confident in the role. Some volunteers cover two shifts per month while other volunteers provide ad-hoc cover.

<u>In-Patient Unit (IPU)</u>

IPU volunteers come into the Hospice once a week from 9am - 11am and assist with a number of tasks. These include tidying up and re-stocking the kitchen, taking patient's menu choices, assisting with laundry and also offering refreshments to the patients.

Hospice Charity Shops

Most volunteers help out at the shops once or twice a week and duties include serving customers, sorting donations and general shop duties. The shops are open 9.30am - 4pm on Mondays, 9.30am - 4.30pm Tuesday to Friday and 9am - 4.30pm Saturdays. The donation centre is open on Mondays and Thursdays 9am - 4pm and Saturdays 9am - 12pm. We also currently have a pop-up shop in Smith Street, St Peter Port, check out our social media pages for opening times.

<u>Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme</u>

Duke of Edinburgh Students volunteer at our charity shops for 2 hours on alternate Saturdays to gain their volunteering award, duties are as above.
